

### **III. Reduced-Fee Referral Committee:**

ICP offers a Reduced Fee Referral Service for anyone who may be interested in seeking assistance with a qualified and experienced psychoanalyst or possibly from a psychoanalyst in training. Each psychoanalyst in training must complete three 18-month control cases, these cases must meet 3 -5 times per week and are supervised by a Training & Supervising Analyst, often these cases can be found at a greatly reduced fee.

If you, as a candidate in training, is seeking a control case, please contact the Committee Chair, Cheryl Chenot, at 310-836-2111 to discuss obtaining a referral.

### **IV. Candidate ICP Costs for the Psychoanalytic Program**

#### **A. Requirements**

The annual expense for a candidate is a combination of tuition, analyst fee and supervisor fee. The tuition is fixed. Both analyst's and supervisor's fees are privately negotiated with the candidate.

Control cases typically span more than two or three years, so the candidate likely requires continuing supervision and analysis through the four years of coursework.

Psychoanalysis: 4 times a week analysis until 300 hours are completed. Analysis must continue 2 times a week until control cases are completed.

Supervision: 3 control cases are required, each lasting 18 months. A candidate may do 1 or more cases at a time. What follows is an estimated cost.

#### **B. Estimate of Four-Year Costs**

First Year: tuition: \$3,300 analysis: \$25,000 supervision: \$9,360

Second Year: tuition: \$3,300 analysis: \$25,000 supervision: \$9,360

Third Year: tuition: \$3,300 analysis: \$6,000 supervision: \$9,360

Fourth Year: tuition: \$3,300 analysis: \$6,240 supervision: \$9,360

**V. Scholarship:** Task Force to Address Racism & Homophobia offers the Ethnic Minority Scholarship which is to help candidates of color in our various programs with the cost of tuition.

**VI.
